Images of America *Downtown Phoenix*

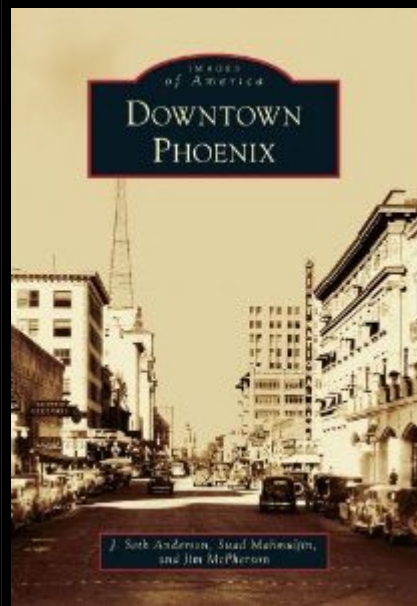
"On October 20, 1870, residents living in adobe structures that lined dirt streets adopted the name *Phoenix*, expressing the optimism of the frontier. For decades, downtown Phoenix was a dense urban core, the hub of agricultural fields, mining settlements, and military posts. Unfortunately, suburban sprawl and other social factors of the post-World War II era led to the center's decline. With time, things, changed, and now downtown Phoenix is uniquely positioned to rise again as a prominent 21st-century American city."
